Highlights for TCVFD for the year 2001 include:

- 5 new members joined our department, John and Pam Burkes, Bunny Bowers, Ken Rieke and Steve Renten.
- Four members left the department during the year, Jim Churchill, Jim Goss, Phil Villaloboz and Bunny Bowers.
- TCVFD currently have 14 responders, 13 firefighters (of which, 8 are EMT-B's) and 1 Paramedic.
- TCVFD had four firefighters attended the Weaverville Oil Fire School.
- TCVFD purchased a 4-wheel ambulance.
- TCVFD responded to 2 Mutual Aide forest fire calls, one in Weaverville the other at Hayfork.
- One major Trinity Center fire occurred in November with the loss of The Old School House.
- Two firefighters became EMT-B's in December.
- Both TCVFD and Coffee Creek Volunteer Fire Company (CCVFC) together brought the North Lake fire repeater on line just before the winter snows thanks to many hours volunteered by department personnel. This repeater will improve TCVFD and CCVFC radio communication locally and will become operational countywide in the summer of 2002.
